Eppendorf Award 2008 for Young European Investigators

Eppendorf honors outstanding biomedical research

Since 1995 the Eppendorf Young Investigator Award is granted annually to European researchers not older than 35 years. It acknowledges outstanding contributions to biomedical research in Europe based on methods of molecular biology, including novel analytical concepts.

Selection criteria

- 1. Ability to work independently
- 2. Creativity
- 3. Successful practical application of research approach
- 4. Significance of research results for the field of medicine
- 5. Achievement of candidate in relation to his/her age

Independent committee

The winner is selected by an independent expert committee chaired by Kai Simons (Max Planck Institute for Molecular Cell Biology and Genetics, Dresden, Germany).

You could be next to win the Award and to receive:

- a prize money of 15,000 Euro
- an invitation to the prize ceremony in Düsseldorf on 20 November. 2008
- an invitation to visit Eppendorf AG in Hamburg
- coverage of your work by Nature in print and in a podcast

How to apply for the Eppendorf Award for Young European Investigators

Your online application must include:

- a title summarizing your submitted work
- your curriculum vitae
- your publication list
- PDF files of max. 3 of your published papers
- an essay of max. 300 words summarizing the submitted papers

Intention of the Eppendorf Award

1995 saw Eppendorf celebrate its 50th anniversary. To commemorate this occasion, Eppendorf initiated an annual award of 15,000 Euro. This award, which reflects the past and the future of Eppendorf, symbolizes the close links between the company and the field of biomedicine. The award intends to motivate young biomedical researchers in Europe in acknowledging their creativity and diligence.

The Eppendorf Award for Young European Investigators is presented in partnership with Nature.

Selection criteria

- 1. Ability to work independently (candidate's own contribution to work submitted)
- 2. Creativity (independent of instructions from head of institute)
- 3. Successful practical application of research approach
- 4. Significance of research results for the field of medicine
- 5. Achievement of candidate in relation to his/her age
